Please do not enter our building for any reason if you are wearing scented products of any kind. We have several students and staff who become very unwell when they encounter scents. Some examples (but not limited to) include body lotions/sprays, fabric softeners, essential oils, perfumes/colognes, hair sprays, after shaves, etc. Thank you for keeping our students and staff healthy and safe.

Wellness at School

A reminder to parents/guardians, students, staff and visitors to Westwood Primary School that you should not attend school if you are feeling unwell.

If you or your child has any of the following symptoms you should NOT attend school:

- Fever (38°C or higher) / chills
- Worsening cough
- Body / muscle / joint aches/unusual headache
- Gastrointestinal symptoms (nausea, vomiting, diarrhea)
- Shortness of breath / difficulty breathing
- Sore/raw throat/consistent runny nose

Exemptions include on-going, existing conditions and symptoms that would not be new or unusual for that individual (e.g., chronic allergies, asthma, etc.)

It is important that we all work together to keep our school environment healthy for all students, staff and visitors so that attendance and staffing is not impacted by illness.

If your child is required to take medication during the school day a Administer Medication form must be completed first. All medications must be sent premeasured. Medications are to be dropped off at the OFFICE by a parent. Medications are kept and administered in the OFFICE.

A Note of Thanks

Thanks to all parents and guardians for working hard at getting your children to school on time for our 8:30 am start, we really appreciate it. As you know, being on time for school has a huge impact on learning. Some students have specialized programs at the beginning of the day such as Resource or specialty classes such as Music and Physical Education. It is **very** important that students arrive on time to receive all their school instruction.

There will, of course, be times when your child has a dental or medical appointment and may arrive late but overall we're noticing that most are arriving on time and it's helping us to get off to a great start this year! ***If you do happen to arrive late for school (after 8:30 am), please walk your child to the front door, we will buzz you and your child in and you can sign them in at the office.***

Attendance & Engagement

Did you know that being 15-30 minutes late per day for school equals 9-18 days of school instructional time lost over the course of the school year... that equals an entire month of school missed. Being on time for school is so important. School attendance and engagement are crucial because they directly impact academic achievement, socio-emotional development, and long-term life outcomes. Regular attendance ensures students learn essential content and skills, while engagement fosters positive learning environments, crucial social connections, and a sense of belonging.

Academic Impact

- **Improved Performance:**

Consistent attendance allows students to stay on track, access breakfast program, understand expectations and routines and access interventions and specialist classes.

- **Foundation for Reading:**

Early attendance, especially in Kindergarten and first grade, is critical for achieving grade-level reading proficiency, which is a strong predictor of success in high school.

- **Indicator of Success:**

Class attendance has the most impact on learning than any other single indicator of academic performance.

Socio-Emotional Development

- **Skill Building:**

School is a vital space for developing essential social, emotional, and cognitive skills that build confidence and support learning.

- **Sense of Belonging:**

Engagement and a sense of connection to the school community, peers, and teachers help students feel valued and supported.

- **Positive Behaviors:**

Attending school and being engaged promotes positive behaviors both in and out of the classroom.

End of Day Pick Up

Dismissal time at Westwood Primary is 2:30 pm. We are asking that all parents/guardians please respect this time. If you need to pick your child up on a particular day early for an appointment, we ask that you please send a note or call ahead before 1:00 pm so that we can have the student waiting in the office at the appropriate time. ***Buzzing into the classrooms to ask for a student interrupts the instruction and learning for ALL students. We will not be buzzing in to classrooms unless there is an emergency.***

We encourage families to please park in the guest parking area and walk to the front of the school to meet your child for after school pick up at 2:30pm. **Please do not block the bus lane entrance at any time while you are dropping off or picking up your child.** Our buses serve four schools in the Bluefield family of schools and must be on time to pick up students for their next runs. Please yield to Buses at all times while on school property

Bus Notes/Passes

This year we have a number of buses that are full and cannot accept bus passes. Students are not permitted to receive bus notes to go to a friend's house for birthday parties, get together, etc. Bus passes are to be issued only for primary childcare. Last minute bus changes must be called in no later than 1:45 pm.

Lockdown Drill

During the month of September we practiced fire drills. The children did extremely well and are very well prepared! In October we will be practicing our lockdown drill. This drill is a three-step process.

In the first step (Week of October 8th), the classroom teacher will explain the purpose of the drill. All teachers use a common script for this so that all the children get the same message regardless of the class or teacher. During this week, the class will practice moving to the designated 'safe area' in their classroom and specialist classes at a time that is convenient for the class.

In the second step (Week of October 13th), we will conduct a School-Wide Drill. As per Public Schools Branch policy, we have been doing lockdown drills at Westwood for many years and they have gone very smoothly. If you have any questions or concerns please contact Ms. Flynn or Mr. Richard. If you find that your child is anxious about this procedure, please contact one of the counsellors, Mrs. Wood or Mr. Sirois.

The third-step of the process involves a school lockdown practice accompanied by the RCMP liaison officers. This will be scheduled for later October or early November. Please note that if you are visiting the school on any of the dates above, you may have to wait outside the building until the drill is completed, if we are practising at that time – there will be a sign on the front door that says, "Lockdown Drill in Progress".

Shoe Tying & Safety

At Westwood Primary we understand that learning to tie shoes helps in the development of fine motor skills, dexterity in fingers, and hand-eye coordination, which are crucial for various activities like writing, drawing, and manipulating objects. It is an important milestone that promotes independence and self-care abilities. We do recognize that our students are at different areas in their development regarding this skill. However, we would like to make parents aware that if children do not have the independence of tying their shoes it can sometimes lead to an accident on the playground, in physical education class and during movement activities in music. If your child is still learning this skill there are a few things you can do to help keep them safe at school during all activities that require movement:

- Wear shoes that have a velcro closure, slip on shoe or curly laces that help keep shoes on and laces tied.
- Continue to keep practicing tying shoes at home with your child

Positive Parenting from Two Homes – For Kids

Westwood we will be offering "When Mom and Dad Separate" which is Westwood's version of *Positive Parenting from 2 Homes for Kids* which is operated from the provincial government. It is an excellent educational program designed to support kids in understanding that your family is still your family even after separation and/or divorce. This program talks about the changes that families often go through by discussing topics such as:

- There are many kinds of families
- The many different feelings they might have about the changes
- Tools to help communicate feelings
- Positive changes that can happen
- Challenges
- Coping with additions to the family (Mom and Dad get new partners/kids)

This group will be held once per week and run for five weeks. This will be held during school time. Students will be in two groups (Kindergarten & Grade 1) and (Grades 2 & 3). There is great power in seeing that you are not alone in this journey. If you would like your child to participate, please contact School Counsellor Cindy Wood at 902-368-6855. A permission form to participate will then be sent home.

A.M. Drop Off Reminders

Children may be dropped off any time after 8:05 a.m. when STAFF are VISIBLE outside to receive them

Please note: there is no supervision available for students prior to 8:05 am.

- Maximum speed limit on school property is 10km/hr
- If you'll be dropping your children off at school, we ask that you drive slowly on the inside of the yellow barriers and drop children off in front of the school CURB SIDE.
- **There is NO PARKING at the front of the school or by the dumpsters or along the lane in/out of the school.** Please park in the newly converted visitor parking area (old tennis courts) and walk over to the school using the crosswalk area.
- When parents are dropping their children off in the morning, we ask that you stay in the line until all the cars ahead of you have exited. There are pylons in the lane so **no passing** is permitted. This is to ensure student safety while exiting the vehicles.
- Students MUST be ready and dressed and exit the vehicle quickly on the sidewalk side of the car. If your child is not ready to exit quickly, please park in the visitor parking lot and walk them to the sidewalk in front of the school. Please be considerate of others by having your child exiting the vehicle quickly.
- Parents should be staying in line to drop their child(ren) off. Please do not pull by the side of the school by the garbage cans to let your child out as this is an unsafe location and blocks the arrival of other vehicles in the staff lot. Thank you 😊

Bus Safety

All students attended a grade level assembly about bus safety.

Safety rules discussed with students:

- Board the bus when the bus has come to a complete stop and the red lights are flashing. Always look at your bus driver to make sure it is safe to cross and board the bus.
- Hold the handrail when getting on and off the bus.
- Students are expected to stay seated facing forward the entire bus ride.
- Students sit seat-to-seat and back-to-back
- Students use a quiet voice on the bus
- Students keep hands and feet to themselves
- No eating or drinking on the bus
- Students follow the instructions of the bus driver.

When waiting for the bus in the morning students should be waiting in their driveway, on a sidewalk or designated safe pick-up area. In the coming months the winter weather will arrive making visibility difficult for vehicles on the road.

Please make sure you are sending cutlery for lunches with your child. We do not have cutlery available at the school. Also please make sure that you **include your child's classroom** when ordering (E.g. 2A, 3F, etc)

Reminder for parents of Grade 3 students... if you have not already sent in your \$10 fee for the purchase of a recorder and music booklet, please do so as soon as possible so that we can order the instruments for the students.

Outdoor Play – Dressing for the Weather

At Westwood Primary, we value the importance of play in the growth and development of our students. We are going to be heading outdoors during our recess times in all kinds of weather. It is important that children are dressed for the weather when they come to school.

For example:

- Rainy Days - children should be wearing boots, splash pants and water-resistant coat (such as a rain coat).
- Snowy Days– children should have winter boots, snow pants & coat, winter hat and mittens
- Sunny Days – Hat to block the sun, cooler/light clothing, footwear they can run and play in (flip flops are sometimes not safe on the equipment)

The only time we will be remaining indoors for recess, is if there is a storm or severe cold temperatures. We are going outside! Please ensure your child(ren) are dressed for the weather.

Outdoor play is critical for young children in schools. Many of the developmental tasks that children must acquire—exploring, risk-taking, fine and gross motor development and the absorption of vast amounts of basic knowledge—can be effectively learned through outdoor play. Children need

opportunities to explore, experiment, manipulate, reconfigure, expand, influence, change, marvel, discover, practice, yell, sing, and create.

Outdoor play enables young children to learn lots and lots and lots of things about the world. How does ice feel and sound? Can sticks stand up in sand? How do plants grow? How does mud feel? Why do we slide down instead of up? How do I make my tricycle go faster? How does the overhang of the building create cool shade from the sun? What does a chrysalis change into? How do butterflies have to learn to fly?

Children need lots of opportunities outdoors to develop basic social skills and social competencies: pushing each other on the swing, pulling a wagon carrying another child, playing together in the sand, imaginative play, dramatic play and so on.

Outdoor play also provides a chance to practice social and emotional skills with other children, including problem solving, turn taking, encouragement, self-control, safe risk taking, and following the rules of a game.
