End-Of-Year Activity Day

This year all students in Grades 1-3 will be going on a field trip on June 19th with a rain date of June 20th to Shining Waters. Our students are not permitted in the pool; however, the are allowed in the splash pad/waterslides in accordance with Shining Waters height guidelines.

The Kindergarten classes will be going on June 20th (rain date June 21st) to Alexander and Darlene's Farm Haven in Stanley Bridge as well as Cavendish Grove (the old Rainbow Valley site). One group of Kindergarten classes will start at the farm and the other group will start at Cavendish Grove. They will have lunch together at the Grove and then they will switch locations.

Permission forms for both groups will be going home soon with students. Parents will be able to pay by sending in cash or by paying through our Hot Lunches program. Hot Lunches will be set up to accept payment by June 7th.

Volunteers for Shining Waters

Parent volunteers are key to a successful year end field trip. We try to keep our groups small and manageable for our volunteers. Some of our classes still need parent volunteers to help chaperone students on our school field trips. You will be required to provide a Criminal Record Check (Vulnerable Sector Check) and our Administrative Assistants can help you with this in the office. Please keep in mind that it takes at least a week for the CRCs to be prepared so give yourself time for the CRC to be processed by the RCMP. The following classes still require volunteers. The number of volunteers required is in brackets beside the class. If you do not see the class on the list, that class has sufficient volunteers. Bus

As the excitement builds to the end of the school year, students are going to need frequent reminders about expected safe behavior on the bus. Please review frequently with your child the following safety rules: wait safely for the bus at your stop (no horseplay), sit seat to seat back to back, face forward, use a quiet voice and keep hands and feet to yourself. Our bus drivers appreciate your support with reviewing these important safety expectations with your children.

Scent Free School

Please ensure that anything you are sending to school is SCENT FREE. We have had an increase with sunscreen and bug spray coming into the building with the warmer weather. These products need to be scent free. We have a number of staff and students who become extremely unwell when they encounter scents. We have had to send staff and students home from school recently due to reactions to scented products. Please be mindful to not wear any scented products as well during pick ups, visits to the school, dropping off items etc. Thank you for keeping us all healthy at school.

Seasonal Dress & Sunscreen

Just a reminder that unless there is a steady, heavy rain, the children go outside for fresh air and outdoor play, so please make sure that they have splash pants, a raincoat, and rubber boots. The UV rays are very strong this time of year, so please remember to put UNSCENTED sunscreen on your child before he/she comes to school. We would also ask that you please label your child's clothing. When the sun comes out the jackets come off and often students do not recognize their own clothing. Please send some sunscreen in his/her school bag so that it can be reapplied if necessary. It is great to see so many children coming off the busses these sunny mornings with sun hats! Thanks and enjoy the warmer weather!!
