# Happy New Year & Welcome Back!

Happy New Year to all of our Westwood families! We hope you had a wonderful holiday season. We are looking forward to a productive and enjoyable next few months full of learning and fun at school!

#### Winter Weather Clothing

Please make sure that your child(ren) are coming to school dressed for the outdoor weather. It is important during the winter months that children have warm boots, snow pants, winter jacket, hat and mittens/gloves (2 pairs). All of our classes have recess outside for 30 minutes daily. The only time we would have an indoor recess is if there is extreme cold (Eg. Wind chill -20C). We do not have extra snow pants or winter coats on hand at school. It is also important to pack a change of clothes and extra socks in the event your child becomes wet or soiled during the day (E.g. spilled lunch on themselves, toilet accident, wet and cold from recess, etc). Thanks for your help with this.

#### Westwood Primary Home & School Meeting

We hope you will join us on January 25<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 pm in the Staff Room at Westwood Primary School. Come meet the new Home & School Executive and hear about the great things happening at your child's school.

#### End of Day Pick Up

*Please do not arrive at the school until 2:00 pm or later.* Otherwise the lane at the front of the school becomes blocked and we cannot receive deliveries and/or parents who are picking up children for appointments get blocked in the pick-up lane. Thanks for your cooperation.

# **Morning Drop Off**

**Please do not drop students off to school until 8:05 am.** Staff are **not** available until this time. If you arrive early and are in the student drop off lane, please keep children inside your vehicle until 8:05 am. This is when our staff head outside for outdoor supervision and when our staff inside the school are ready to receive students and exterior doors are unlocked to receive students. Thank you for your cooperation!

#### **Bus Safety**

Parents/Guardians, as we move into the winter season it is more important than ever that the children are being safe and orderly on the bus. Please take some time to review appropriate bus safety with your children. All classes have had bus safety discussions, but from time to time they require review. At school we stress the following when we talk with the students about safe and appropriate bus manners:

1) "Back to back & seat to seat" describes how they should be sitting on the bus

- 2) Sitting at all times when the bus is moving and staying seated until the bus arrives at your stop
- 3) Using a quiet voice Level 1 (silence) or Level 2 (whisper, soft talk) voice.
- 4) No eating or drinking on the school bus
- 5) Keeping hands and feet on their own body

6) When waiting for the school bus during winter weather we ask that you have your child wait in the drive way, **NOT on the side of the road**. Often vehicles cannot see the students because of the snowbanks

7) Please remind the students that it is not safe to be playing in the snow while waiting for the bus

Please make sure that your children are ready at their pick-up location a few minutes prior to bus pick up time. Please keep in mind the bus cannot wait for students, as this can put the bus driver behind schedule at other schools. Most of our buses also drive for the junior high and high school. Please stress that everyone's safety is compromised when students are not following these procedures. Thanks for reviewing this important information at home.

#### 2024-2025 Kindergarten Registration

All children who will be **5 years old by December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024** are eligible to attend Kindergarten in the 2024-2025 school year. You can register your child by dropping in to the school between 9:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. You must have documents that show proof of birth, as well as, address verification at the time of registration. *Planning for the 2024-2025 school year is happening NOW, so knowing the size of our 2024-2025 Kindergarten enrollment and any student that require additional support is vital in assisting us with staffing our school appropriately to support student learning.* 

#### Breakfast Program

A huge thank-you to our wonderful breakfast volunteers. You help our students have a great start to the day. *Please keep in mind there is no breakfast program when there is a school delay in the morning.* 

#### **Breakfast Program Donations**

If families are interested in donating breakfast food, we gratefully accept whole wheat bread, strawberry jam, yogurt tubes, apples, mini-carrots and cucumbers. There is also an option to donate to the breakfast program on the January Hot Lunch menu.

#### **PEI School Food Program**

PEI School Food Program is a "Pay What You Can" model up to \$5.75 per meal. It provides healthy lunches to students each school day. Lunches are ordered in advance. *We ask that you please ensure that you enter your child's class (E.g. 2B) when ordering to ensure that your child receives their food.* Having the correct class helps to ensure your child's lunch gets delivered to the correct classroom. # Milk Orders /Hot Lunch Online Program

Milk and pizza can be purchased for students using the Hot Lunches ordering system. The website is <u>westwood.hotlunches.net</u>. Parents can purchase white Milk (50 cents), chocolate Milk (80 cents) daily. We are currently offering the option on Tuesdays to purchase pizza from Little Caesar's cheese or pepperoni pizza (\$3.00). On Wednesdays, students can purchase 4 Crazy bread from Little Casear's for \$3. **Orders will be placed for a month at a time and must be placed and paid for online at 11:59 pm by the dates below.** We are unable to accept any late orders. Unpaid orders will be deleted.

March orders – Deadline is Sunday, March 3<sup>rd</sup>

April orders – Deadline is Sunday, March 31<sup>st</sup>

June orders – Deadline is Sunday, May 28<sup>th</sup>
