School Bus Tags

Students will be arriving home with bus tags on their kitbags. We ask that you do not remove these tags. The information on the tag is used by teachers, bus drivers and substitutes in our building. If you notice that there is an error on the information on the bus tag, please send a note to the school indicating what the correct information should be and we can make the changes. We will be making changes to many of these tags as we get up to date after school plans from families. Thank you.

School Day Start Time & End Time

Instruction begins at **8:30** am each day, so please ensure that if you're dropping your child(ren) off that they are here by **8:25am**. If you arrive after 8:30 am, your child will need to enter through the front door and will need to be signed in late by you. The late sign-in book is located in the office on the counter.

Also, please note that there is no supervision provided before 8:05 am. Children cannot be dropped off before 8:05 am. Children can be dropped off anytime between 8:05 am and 8:30 am. We also would like to remind parents that we are encouraging students to walk to their hollow doors on their own in the mornings to enter their classes. This helps to develop independence and routine for our students.

If you wish to speak to the classroom teacher please enter through the front doors to register as a visitor, collect an ID tag and proceed down to the classroom.

Our school day at Westwood Primary ends at 2:30 pm. If you are picking your child up early for an appointment, please phone the school and we will let the child and the teacher know. You should park in the visitor parking area (old tennis court) and come to the front door. Buzz the front door and we will send your child out.

We do not encourage picking your child up early to "beat the rush" at dismissal. Instruction for students continues until 2:30pm everyday.

Utensils for Lunch

PEI Healthy School Lunch Program and Westwood Primary do not provide plastic spoons, fork and straws at snack or lunch time. Please make sure you are packing utensils for your child in their lunch bag.

New Signage on School Grounds

The school property now has new signage. Please make sure to yield to BUSES at all times on school property. Also, the posted speed limit on school property is a MAXIMUM of 10km. Cross walks and parking areas are now clearly marked. There is NO PASSING in the student drop off lane.

Thanks you for helping to keep everyone safe at Westwood Primary School.

Morning Drop Off & Afternoon Pick Up

Children may be dropped off any time after 8:05 a.m. Please note that there is no supervision provided before 8:05 am. If you'll be dropping your children off at school, we ask that you drive slowly on the inside of the yellow barriers and drop

children off in front of the school. **THERE IS NO PARKING PERMITTED ALONG THE CURBSIDE AT THE FRONT OF THE SCHOOL OR ALONG THE LANE IN AND OUT OF THE SCHOOL.** Visitor parking is to the left as you enter the school property.

For safety and courtesy, we ask that you drive your vehicle to the <u>end of the drop-off lane</u> before stopping to make the drop off. Please have your child exit the vehicle on the SIDEWALK SIDE for safety reasons. Students are expected to enter the school via their hollow door when they arrive in the morning when school staff are outside on duty. <u>The main door entry is for Kindergarten, 2D and 3F students only.</u>

Cars are not permitted to use the bus lane way or park in the bus parking lot between 8:00 a.m. & 3:00 p.m. (Unless otherwise specified; such as, a concert during the school day)

If you are picking your child up at the end of the day, please park in the visitor parking area and come to the front of the school to meet them. NOTEL Students are dropped off to parents waiting out front AFTER students have been taken to their buses. Please do not grab your child out of the line, as the teacher may not see it and it can create some panic thinking a student is missing. Thanks for working with us to keep the children safe!

Parents are not permitted in the BUS area. If you are arriving unexpectedly for a pick-up, please go into the school and request your child through the office. The office will radio the staff in the bus area to bring your child to the front of the school to meet you. This is for safety of all students and staff.

PLEASE NOTE: Any unexpected changes to your child's afterschool plan must be phoned in prior to 1:00 pm in order to ensure that a new bus note or pick up message arrives to your child's class on time. We cannot accept any changes after 1:00 pm each day, as the office staff is too busy preparing and delivering bus notes and pick up messages to the classrooms. Thank you for your support with this.

Wellness at School

A reminder to parents/guardians, students, staff and visitors to Westwood Primary School that you should not attend school if you are feeling unwell.

If you or your child has any of the following symptoms you should NOT attend school:

- Fever (38°C or higher) / chills
- New or worsening cough
- Body / muscle / joint aches/unusual headache
- Gastrointestinal symptoms (nausea, vomiting, diarrhea)
- Shortness of breath / difficulty breathing
- Sore/raw throat/consistent runny nose

Exemptions include on-going, existing conditions and symptoms that would not be new or unusual for that individual (e.g., chronic allergies, asthma, etc.)

It is important that we all work together to keep our school environment healthy for all students, staff and visitors so that attendance for students and staff is not impacted by illness.

Breakfast Program

We are excited to announce that Westwood's Breakfast program is back for another great year. The start date for the breakfast program will be Monday, September 25th. Beginning at 8:05 am, students in Grades 1-3 will be coming to the multi-purpose room and volunteers will be serving milk, water, fruit, veggies and toast. After 8:20am, students will be asked to take their breakfast to eat in their classrooms so clean up can begin. Students in Kindergarten will eat their breakfast in their classrooms. Their breakfast will consist of Cheerios and fruit.

Volunteers Needed for the Breakfast Program

In order for our breakfast program to be a success, we need volunteers. We are looking for volunteers who can commit to one day a week (it works best if it's the same day each week for planning purposes). Volunteers are required from 7:50 am - 8:50 am (approximately). It is important that volunteers arrive early in order to have breakfast ready for student arrival at 8:05. Volunteers will be preparing toast, cutting fruit and veggies, serving students and cleaning up.

Volunteers will need to submit a criminal record check in order to volunteer in schools. You can obtain a letter from the school to get a criminal record check free of charge. It usually takes a week to obtain a CRC. We will need your full name and date of birth to prepare the letter. Along with your letter, you will also need to take a copy of your driver's license as well as your health card. We can copy those documents here if you do not have access to a photocopier. Westwood Online Hot Lunches and Milk Program

Milk and pizza can be purchased for students using the Hot Lunches ordering system. The website is westwood.hotlunches.net. Parents can purchase white Milk (50 cents), chocolate Milk (80 cents) daily. We are currently offering the option on Tuesdays to purchase pizza from Little Caesar's cheese or pepperoni pizza (\$3.00). We hope to be able to order additional food as the year progresses. Orders will be placed for a month at a time and must be placed and paid for online at 11:59 pm by the dates below. We are unable to accept any late orders. Unpaid orders will be deleted. The September schedule is now open for ordering.

PEI School Food Program

The PEI School Food Program is a provincial lunch program that offers ALL island students K-12 a healthy and affordable lunch 5 days per week! Parents can place their orders online https://www.peischoolfood.ca.

Please Note: this program is not run by the school. If you have questions about the program, the contact information is on the website.

Ordering will take place biweekly (10 school days at a time). Ordering will open on Saturday mornings and close on Thursdays at noon for meals to begin the following Monday. When you order your child(ren)'s meal online, please make sure you include the child's first and last name AND their Class. (E.g. John Smith 3B) The meal will be prepared with the student's name & class and will be delivered to the school at lunch time.

The PEI School Food Program will offer a Pay What You Can Program (PWYC). The PWYC Program allows students to choose the amount they can pay:

- 1) I can pay the entire meal value (\$5.75)
- 2) I can pay a partial amount of the meal value
- 3) I cannot pay the meal value

Please pay for your meal if you're able to, to help those who are not! Collectively, we play our part so that every Island student has access to a healthy lunch to help them grow and learn.

Peanut/Nut/Tree Nut/Kiwi/Egg Allergies and Scent Free Environment

Due to severe, life-threatening allergies, Westwood is a peanut/nut/tree nut/kiwi (including kiwi juice – please check juice boxes carefully) free school. We ask you to take the time to read labels carefully, so that we do not have foods containing any of these products in student lunches.

Please note: Some classes may have class specific allergy restrictions. If this is the case, a email will be sent home notifying you of the prohibited item. E.g. Egg, strawberries, bananas, eggs, etc

We ask parents **NOT** to bake or send in food items for their child(ren)'s classes. If you would like to send something special to your child(ren)'s class, please contact the teacher about suggestions other than food. Thanks!

The Public Schools Branch also has a **SCENT FREE POLICY** in all of it schools and at the school branch office. We would ask that any visitors, staff & students refrain from wearing any scented products in our building. This includes and not limited to; strong fabric softener, colognes or perfumes, scented body lotions, etc. We have several students and staff in our building who become ill or have reactions around scented products. Please share this information with family or friends who may be picking your child up from school. Thanks for your cooperation and support with this.

Further information will be sent home pertaining to life threatening allergies.

Gently Used Clothing

Westwood is looking for any extra clothing in good shape that can be donated to the school. We are looking for pants, shirts, gym pants and sweat shirts that would fit students aged 4-8. Often the students have spills or accidents at school and do not have extra clothing packed in their bags to change into. We would greatly appreciate any donations. School Pictures

Lifetouch will be at school on October 18th & 19th to do the school pictures. Any students who are absent will have their pictures taken on the retake date. Please note: we do not have any way of ensuring which classes will have their pictures taken on specific dates.

PEI School Accident Insurance Program

Every eligible student attending a PEI school is automatically insured by the PEI School Accident Insurance Program's basic student coverage. This program is provided without a deductible and at no cost to the student, parents/guardians. Basic coverage is provided during school hours, school activities, community-based learning activities and travel to and from school and community-based learning activities.

Students Under 40 lbs.

Kindergarten students who were under 40 lbs at registration will be weighed to determine if they are still under 40 lbs. Students who are under 40 lbs. are required to be buckled in a 5 point harness on the school bus. Parents will be notified next week if their child is under 40 lbs. Students must be able to buckle and unbuckle independently; bus drivers are not permitted to get out of their seats to assist.

Teachers and Educational Assistants can buckle/unbuckle students at school; however, parents will have to make arrangements to have an adult board the bus to buckle/unbuckle students in the morning and afternoon.

We encourage parents to practice buckling and unbuckling their car seats with their children. If parents would like their child buckled on the bus before the end of next week, please contact your child's teacher to let them know as they will have to buckle them at the end of the day.

Important Bussing Information

Our drivers are continuing to fine tune their pick-ups and drop off times. Please make sure that your child is at the bus stop a few minutes early as we continue to work through this process over the next few weeks.

<u>Please Note</u>: Parents are **NOT** permitted in the bus area at school for any reason. If you are picking up your child, please contact the office. We will then get your child(ren) for you from the bus and take them to meet you. Thank you for your cooperation with this.

Bus Safety

Students will be engaging in bus safety sessions at the school.

Please continue to discuss and support bus safety at home. Here is the link for a great bus video to share at home. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=n-vx9zN_nGA&t=758s

At Westwood, we ask the students to follow the safety rules outlined below:

- How to properly wait for a bus (no fooling around, being kind to others, no pushing)
- Holding the handrail getting on and off the bus.
- Sitting seat to seat, back to back with backpack on lap, seat (if room) or floor (if room)
- No eating, drinking or taking things out of backpack on bus
- Use quiet voice
- Stay seated the entire bus ride facing forward
- Keeping our bodies to ourselves

- Walking to and from the bus
- When walking to the school, students should NEVER walk on the curb. Students should walk close to the grass to be safe.

School Occupational Therapy Program at Westwood Primary

Hello Westwood Families! I would like to introduce myself as the OT with the School Therapy/Occupational Therapy (OT) Program. My name is Nicole MacLauchlan and I am the OT for Westwood Primary. I am very much looking forward to working at your child's school for the 2023-2024 school year. I will be at Westwood Primary School every Days 1 and 2.

Occupational Therapists (OTs) work with children of all ages and know a lot about children's development in the areas of:

- **Fine motor and visual motor skills** (e.g., support: printing, drawing, cutting, keyboarding, completing fasteners, tying shoelaces, using a lock, etc.).
- **Sensory processing** (e.g., being comfortable with sounds, lightening, smells, texture/touch, and movement within the school environment that we encounter during our day).
- **Environmental set-up** (e.g., ensuring the environment works to meet everyone's needs from flexible seating to wheelchair accessibility, etc.).
- **Safety and Participation** (e.g., support moving safely within the school, participating in movement breaks, specialty classes, school clubs, recess, etc.).

The focus of the School Therapy OT program is to work together with classroom teachers, school staff and parents /guardians to support children's motor and sensory development in order to assist children in achieving their learning goals, successfully participating in school and most importantly feeling good about themselves and school! To do this, I will be spending time in classrooms, small group settings, gym, music and library classes as well as on the playground. Throughout the day, I will be offering guidance, suggestions and tips.
